SCHEDULE FOR 2013
REQUEST FOR WEEKLY TEACHING MINISTRY TEAMS

The Mobile School of Theology (MSOT), a ministry of the Presbyterian Church in Uganda (PCU), was founded to bring theological training to local church leaders because many cannot afford the time or money to attend Westminster Theological College. The MSOT has two thrusts – to provide certificates for students who faithfully attend specific courses over a period of months, and to offer seminars on the same subjects in areas where biblical training is lacking.

The Mobile School Faculty, led by Elder David Kabaale is asking like-minded brothers and sisters to come and join them as they teach and train around Uganda. Some of the weeks listed below in the 2013 schedule are MSOT centers where students are working towards certificates. Others are seminars for any leaders who are interested, no matter the denomination. Either way, the biblical teaching is the same.

For the most effective training week, the Mobile School requests that the teaching ministry team bring between 2-4 people. Women are more than welcome to be a part of the team, we just need to know which subjects each team member would like to address. Or if team members would like to offer a special week for women or children, we can try to organize that. All teaching will be done alongside one of the Mobile School training faculty. Thus, there must be a commitment for coordination of teaching of the subjects before coming.

We would ask that the team cover their own expenses, and the expenses of one Mobile School trainer. For the training itself, the local students are required to provide their own transportation as well as much of the food as they possibly can for the training. The rest would be covered by the team.

Some weeks run consecutively, so teams are more than welcome to come for more than one week of teaching. (The faculty is unable to arrange side sightseeing trips but will be happy to suggest areas to visit that are close to the centers and to help connect teams with competent people who can.)
