Subject: Sunday, February 26 Update

We arrived safely and on time on Thursday night along with all of our bags. The two back to back eight hour flights are as painful as ever.

We got to the guest house right on time to find there was no power plus we were having trouble with the generator so we did our best to unpack, clean up and get ready for bed with flashlights.

We left right after breakfast on Friday for Kiyoola for their Friday afternoon service. They do not have a midweek Wednesday service but a Friday afternoon gathering. Must be over before dark so everyone can see to walk home. We got back to the guest house Friday night very late, heavy traffic and again, no power.

We hit the road at 8:00 am on Saturday to go back to Kiyoola to speak at the youth conference. We never got off the hill before we developed engine issues and that took some time to get repaired and we were moving again. I failed to note that before we could leave the guesthouse, we had to get a Jerry can of diesel brought in on a motorcycle so we could make it to the petrol station to fill up. Everyone in Uganda wants to ride, but no one wants to pay for fuel so every time we go somewhere, the first stop is for more fuel.

Saturday night we got back really late and again, no power.

Today, Larry Morris went to Seeta Nazigo and taught Sunday School and preached. We funded a meal there so there was a great time of fellowship. As I type this at 8:00 pm he still is not back. But there is good news, the power was restored about 30 minutes ago.

I preached the worship service at Bethel Covenant College (a Christian high school) . There were over 500 students present. The service began at 8:30 with student led singing and ended at 11:20.,

The week of teaching for church leaders begins tomorrow afternoon. My purpose is to present basic Christian teaching to ordinary folks in the church. At most every church I visit I get questions or hear comments that reflect a lot of misunderstanding of the faith. Many of these people have only been Christians for a short while.
