

I finished the teaching seminar this afternoon. Most of the men left after the last session, but a few have remained and will leave first thing in the morning. They have a long drive and wish to get home before dark tomorrow.

It has proven to be a good conference and all the men agreed they would like to return the next time I am back in Uganda.

On a different note, just before I left for Uganda, a longtime faithful supporter of this ministry provided some funds and asked me to use those funds to help some projects.

The first one was a roof for the church at Nyanzi. This is a place even more remote than Kyamagemule. We planted the church there in November of 2015. A mud hut was put up for the church to worship in and they have continued to use that until last Sunday.

The congregation had built a brick structure, carrying stones by hand, one by one, from nearby hills to help make a foundation. They then raised funds to buy cement and bricks over a period of two years. This time last year, they wanted the complete the building by Christmas, but the cost of wood for trusses and iron sheets for the roof was beyond their ability. So Christmas came and went and soon it will be Christmas again, but thanks to a portion of this generous gift, the photos below show the building last Monday morning and last Friday afternoon. The worshiped in the building for the first time this past Sunday.
